COVENTRY UNIVERSITY EXPERIENCE DAY

A small group of Year 13 students were offered the opportunity to visit Coventry University and CU Coventry last week as part of their UCAS decision process. These kind of events are useful in helping students decide on whether to apply to university or finalise their choices. Coventry University and CU Coventry are 2 of our local providers who offer us a huge amount of support. We are part of their Phoenix Partnership which is designed to increase engagement between schools and universities.

As part of the day, students participated in lectures on Business and futures planning, as well as Hospitality, Leisure and Tourism. They then went on a campus tour, seeing the amazing facilities such as their Health and Lifesciences block which includes hospital wards and an ambulance for training, as well as court rooms and prison cells! At the Hinckley Sixth Form we

give impartial advice to all students regarding careers and progression, however, it is important for them to realise the amazing universities and providers we have on our doorstep.

We are now looking forward to April when all of Year 12 will visit Coventry University as part of the partnership for a full experience day. —Mr Boast







Immersed in Wonder at the National History Museum

After successfully collecting 120 Year 9 students early on Tuesday morning, we embarked to the Natural History Museum in London, passing some great sites including Wembley Stadium.

During the visit to the Natural History Museum, the Year 9 students had an exciting and educational experience. They were immersed in the wonders of nature as they explored various exhibits and displays. The students had the opportunity to discover ancient fossils and learn about the evolution of different species, including dinosaurs and early humans. While interactive activities, such as hands-on experiments and live demonstrations, enhanced their understanding and engagement.

The visit sparked curiosity and encouraged the students to appreciate and respect the natural world around them, allowing some of them to ask further questions about the exhibits and focus their attention on understanding more about the natural world. 



HARRY POTTER WORLD - STEM CAREERS TRIP

As part of our 2024 Careers Week, we will be offering all our students in The Bridge the opportunity to visit Harry Potter World. The trip will run for half of the year group on the 5th of March 2024 and the other half of the year group on the 7th March 2024. During the trip students will have a guided tour of Harry Potter World, where the career opportunities involved in the production of the films will be explored. Students will also take part in a STEM lesson where they will either delve into the mathematical skills including scale factor, percentages and fractions to discover how the half-giant Hagrid was brought to life on screen. Or, they will take part in a lesson focusing on the Art of Foley, where students will discover the importance of sound in film and experience one of the most intriguing jobs in film, the Foley artist.
