Compositional Still Life

After investigating and analysing Vanitas Paintings, Year 9 students are currently generating compositional still life ideas that represent the story/ life of a chosen individual. Informed by Vanitas, each composition must include a skull to make connections to this genre. Therefore students have been practicing drawing skulls and anatomy before including them in there compositions. Miss Webster has been absolutely astounded by the quality of the work produced!! After marking the work, identifying areas of strength and how to improve further, students spent their last lesson actively responding to guidance and refining their work. Miss Webster commented on the engagement of the students who were participating in discussion about grading and criteria, with some even asking questions about progression onto GCSE Fine Art in Year 10.

students throughout the day today. As one of our former students, Klaire was able to share her journey from GCSE's and A-Levels, through higher education and into industry and her current career as a lecturer. She also gave students valuable insights into course opportunities (qualifications) and employment potential in the creative industries to inform their options choices at GCSE, A-Level and Post-18.

Alongside this, A-Level students received more specific support and guidance in the construction and presentation of portfolio's for degree course interviews. Throughout the sessions students demonstrated PRIDE with high levels on engagement and we will look to make further links with the University to support outreach



sessions, during which students will have opportunities, including visits to the University, to see their facilities and participate in practical sessions and activities.




'Register & Be a Lifesaver' - ASSET





Mr Froome would like to celebrate some of the recent work produced in EP by his Year 7 students.


He shared, "The year group have been learning about the origins of the earth so far this year and were tasked to produce pieces of work that

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art bytes

YEAR 9 ART COMPETITION

This academic year, The Hinckley School will be entering and competing in the Art Bytes competition; Raising aspirations for better futures by championing the creativity of the nation's next generation, using art and virtual technology. Art Bytes is a

national EdTech programme that utilises a bespoke, immersive, virtual gallery incorporating augmented reality elements, to give young participants the opportunity to see their art exhibited online and engage with new technology from the safety and convenience of their own home or school. After a shortlisting panel and an online public vote, the winning artist from each school sees their work displayed in our virtual gallery. Art Bytes culminates every June with a celebration event at a high-profile cultural venue in each of the nine regions of England, which is also available to schools to stream in the classroom or assembly. Regional winners are announced, certificates and prizes are presented, and the virtual gallery goes live. Miss Webster is looking for submissions of artwork from 30 of our fantastically creative and innovative students to enter into the national competition. The deadline is February half-term 2024.

When submitting work, key things to note:

- Artwork created by Year 9 students in this academic year, whether at home or in school, is eligible.
- One entry per student.
- No set theme, allowing students to express themselves as they wish through their artwork
- Artwork in any fine art medium or technique is acceptable, rather than textiles/design.
- 2D or 3D artwork (please note all 3D work entries will be exhibited as a photograph).
- Artworks created at home should be made without parents or guardians help.

We will of course keep you up to date with entries submitted (with photographs of artwork in our newsletter) and will provide information regarding the vote once the submission window is closed. For further information please speak to Miss Webster.
