YEAR 11 GCSE & CNAT RUGBY MODERATION



YEAR 8 UNBOX THEIR FUTURE












SOLAR SYSTEM









SKILLS FOR LIFE PROGRAMME

Students in Year 9 will be taking part in a 'Skills for Life Programme' over the coming weeks, and have already completed their first session centred around breaking the stigma around mental health. Students received a

programme workbook which shared more information about the purpose of the sessions, "Our Skills for Life programme is thoughtfully designed to provide the next generation with essential skills, tools, knowledge, and the courage needed to navigate life's challenges more adeptly. This program has been carefully shaped by the valuable feedback received during our visits to 63 schools as part of the 100 Talks For Change project. It focuses on the key necessities highlighted by schools, ensuring a gentle and supportive approach to empower our youth for a resilient future. Our mission is to be the voice we so desperately needed when we were younger!"

In future sessions groups will look at the impact of role models, stress management and self-belief before the final session sees students deliver a 2 minute presentation to share their key takeaways.





POWERFUL COLOURED PENCIL DRAWINGS

Our Year 9 artists have been producing some amazing coloured pencil drawings on black card! Students have been encouraged to further develop the application of tone, with the added challenge of blending a minimum of three colours (shadow, midtone and highlight) and white pencil to enhance tone and 3D form. As you can see from the three examples in our latest Spotlight Gallery, some students were keen to demonstrate their confident ability by selecting complimentary (contrasting) colours that are opposing on the colour wheel, to show an exceptional ability to control pressure to gradually transition the selected pencils. Miss Webster was also pleased to see students considering the symbolic meaning of the colours, conveying atmosphere and narrative through the pieces created.


MATILDA - HAVE YOU GOT YOUR TICKETS YET?
